


Redistricting









Every 10 years, after the U.S. Census, the Hillsborough County Board of County Commissioners, the Hillsborough County School Board and the Florida Legislature redraw district boundaries to reflect changes in population.

Each governing body has its own district map, and as your Supervisor of Elections I take all of those maps into account when I define precincts. After redistricting, I adjust precinct lines as needed to align them with the new district lines.



Once our databases have been updated, we will send every voter in Hillsborough County a new Voter Information Card. Your Voter Information Card will contain your precinct and polling place information, as well as your voting districts.
