## It's Time to Get Ready for the City of Tampa Runoff Election



Tampa, FL – Today, Hillsborough County Supervisor of Elections Craig Latimer mailed out more than 20,000 ballots to voters who have requested Vote By Mail ballots for the City of Tampa Runoff Election.

“It’s not too late to request a Vote By Mail ballot, and the simplest way is to call my office at (813) 744-5900 or make the request online at [VoteHillsborough.gov](http://VoteHillsborough.gov),” said Supervisor of Elections Craig Latimer.

Voters can request a mail ballot for the runoff election or for all elections through the end of 2024, and they will need to provide their Florida driver license, Florida ID or the last four digits of their social security number when requesting mail ballots.

For Tampa voters who prefer to vote in person, Early Voting takes place April 17 – 23, and Election Day is April 25. Information about all three methods of voting is available at [VoteHillsborough.gov](http://VoteHillsborough.gov).

During the March 7, 2023 City of Tampa Election, more than 13,000 voters – 41% of those voting – cast their ballot by mail, 21% voted during Early Voting and 38% voted on Election Day. The races for Mayor and City Council Districts 4 and 5 were decided during that election. The April 25, 2023 City of Tampa Runoff Election includes city-wide City Council races in Districts 1, 2 and 3, so all voters living in the City of Tampa will have those races on their ballot. Voters living in District 6 will also have the District 6 race on their ballot.

City of Tampa voters can visit [VoteHillsborough.gov/voterlookup](http://VoteHillsborough.gov/voterlookup) to confirm their information is up to date, check to see if they have a Vote By Mail request on file, and look at their sample ballot. The deadline to register to vote (if not already registered) is March 27.

“Now is the time for voters to visit my website and make their voting plan,” said Supervisor Latimer. “Are you going to vote in person or by mail? Will you vote early or on Election Day? [VoteHillsborough.gov](http://VoteHillsborough.gov) is the place to go to review your options.”
