## Apply To Be A **Poll Worker**



**Are you a civic-minded individual who is interested in working Election Day?**

The application to be a poll worker for the 2022 election cycle is now [live on my website](#). This is a great opportunity to give back to our community.

Our poll workers are trained individuals who are active voters, serving their community with pride and nonpartisanship. They interact well with the public and provide excellent customer service. Additionally, *poll workers are paid for the work they do.*

**To be a poll worker, you must:**

- Be a registered voter in Hillsborough County
- Be able to work a 14-hour day, with patience and courtesy to others
- Successfully complete all training and assessments
- Remain nonpartisan while at the polls
- Treat everyone with dignity and respect at all times

## Spring Cleaning



March is a great time for spring cleaning, but our work to keep our voter roll clean goes on all year. We update our voter roll daily to remove voters who have died or become ineligible to vote, and to update voter addresses that we know have changed. We also contact voters who we think may no longer be living at the address where they're registered. (Watch [Keeping the Roll](#) for more about that.)

*Here's how you can help:*

1. If you have moved or changed your name, visit [VoteHillsborough.gov/VoterLookup](#) to quickly and easily review and submit updates to your information.
2. If you receive mail from our office, please take a look at it and contact us if we need to correct any of your voter information.
3. If you get mail for someone who doesn't live at your address, don't just throw it away. Mark it "Not at this address – return to sender" and give it back to the post office.

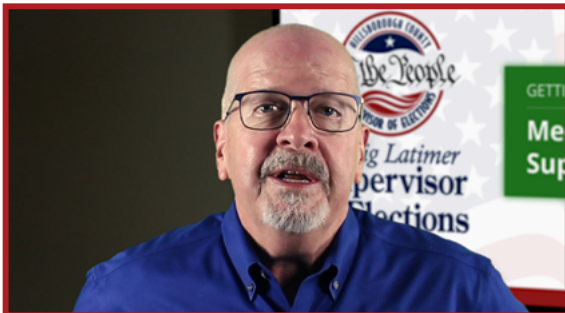

Do you know which elected officials represent you? An easy way to find out is to visit [VoteHillsborough.gov/YourOfficials](http://VoteHillsborough.gov/YourOfficials) and use your street address to look them up.

Just enter your house number in the first field and then your street name in the field below it. While typing your street, a blue bar will appear when it finds your address. Select your address and your precinct information will pop up. Then, choose the Office Holders button to pull up a list of your representatives. It's quick and informative!
