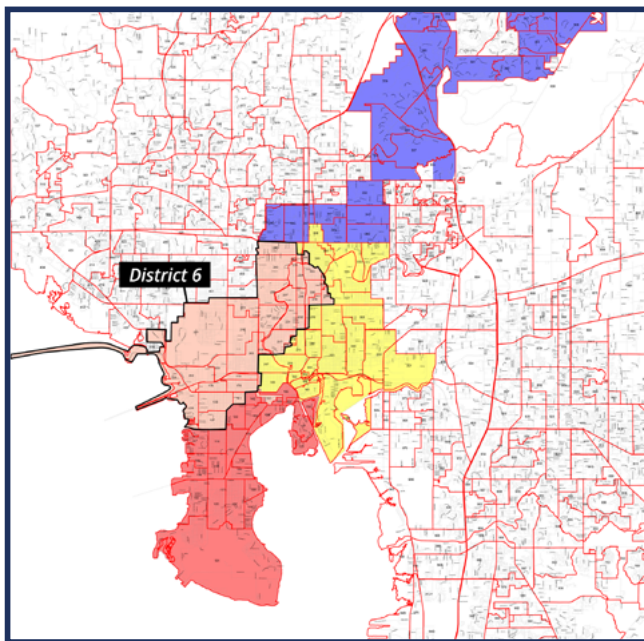

...AND WE ARE HEADED TO A **RUNOFF!**



The City of Tampa Municipal Election is in the Books!

The mayor and two city council members were elected, but the races in Districts 1, 2, 3 and 6 are still to be decided. That's because city council candidates must receive a majority of the votes or they move on to a runoff. During the April runoff election, all City of Tampa voters will vote in the races for Districts 1, 2 and 3 - which are city-wide seats. Voters who live in District 6 will also have that race on their ballot.

Important Dates to Remember

- Deadline to register to vote (if not already registered): March 27
- Deadline to request that a Vote By Mail ballot be mailed to you: April 15

Vote By Mail: Let us deliver the election to you!



Visit VoteHillsborough.gov/VoteByMail or call (813) 612-4180 to request your ballot. You can request Vote By Mail ballots for a single election, or for all elections you're eligible for through the end of 2024. If you're not sure whether you have a current Vote By Mail request for this election, visit VoteHillsborough.gov/VoterLookup or give us a call and we'll be happy to check.

Early Voting: April 17 - 23, 10 a.m. - 6 p.m.



Pick from any of the seven locations that will be open in the city - choose the time and place that works best for you. Visit VoteHillsborough.gov/EarlyVoting for more information.

Election Day: April 25 - 7 a.m. - 7 p.m.



Your LAST chance to vote. On Election Day, you must vote in the polling place assigned to your precinct. Visit VoteHillsborough.gov/FindMyPrecinct to verify your polling place before you head out to vote.

ELECTION SEASON IN PLANT CITY



Plant City voters, you have a decision to make. On April 4th, you can make your voice heard by voting in the race for City Commissioner, Group 4. The deadline to request a Vote By Mail ballot in this election is March 25, and all voted ballots must be in the Supervisor of Elections office by 7 p.m. on Election Day. Early Voting will take place from 9 a.m. – 5 p.m. on March 31 and April 1. Election Day is Tuesday, April 4 from 7 a.m. – 7 p.m. All in-person voting will take place at City Hall, 302 W. Reynolds Street.
